I hope this email finds you well. You asked me to tell you about the summer course I took in Global Leadership in São Paulo, Brazil last month. It is like the programme your sister took in Rio de Janeiro last year. I took the course in order to equip myself with the knowledge and skills I need to succeed in culturally diverse workplaces. After completing the course, I got a job at Buenos Aires College in Argentina.

The course was for seven days. It started on Sunday and finished on Saturday. Though I was excited to join, I started the course one day late on Monday due to bad weather. It was a blended learning course, with online and in-person components. The online elements of the course were taught using the Coursera Learning System (CLS). These included four online discussion sessions, individual assignments and five face-to-face sessions which students had to attend to be awarded their final certificate.

My class was a mixture of different professions and nationalities. We had academic researchers, lab technicians, hotel managers and college tutors like myself. The participants' various backgrounds and experiences added to the flavour of our class. The majority were Brazilian but we also had some participants from Mexico, Spain, and the UK.

The programme organisers aimed to host all the international participants with local families. Unfortunately, the Spanish students and I had to live in hostels due to our late arrival. Imagine some of the students had to be accommodated in hotels because they refused to stay with local families! I would have loved to have stayed with a Brazilian family.

Throughout the course, we were trained to ask critical questions, respond thoughtfully to the issues we both observed and encountered when dealing with people. One big problem I had was how to deal with unexpected situations. We also had the opportunity to improve our skills in essential areas such as project management, teamwork and intercultural communication. What was good about the course was that sufficient time was given to students to focus on their assigned tasks and projects. Unfortunately, some participants failed because they did not actively contribute to the online discussions which of course were all in English.

Mauritius, an island nation in the Indian Ocean, is known for its breathtaking beauty and nature. It is a dream holiday destination for tourists from all over the world. According to the tourist arrivals report published on the Global Database Platform, 1.7 million people visited it in July 2023. Among the top places to visit, the four best are the Black River Gorges National Park, the Chamarel and Flic-en-Flac villages and the Casela Nature Park. The best time to visit Mauritius is in the dry season from May to November.

The Black River Gorges National Park is ideal for tourists who love trekking as it contains 60 square kilometres of trails. Birdwatchers can enjoy visiting the park as it is home to some rare inhabitants, such as the Cuckoo-Shrike and the Pink Pigeon. It also appeals to animal behaviourists who want to study various animal species such as the Mauritian flying fox, wild boars and macaque monkeys. This park is the natural habitat for nine bird species, 300 flowering plants and more than 4000 giant fruit bats that are exclusive to Mauritius.

The village of Chamarel, located in the southwest part of the island, is famous for its natural beauty. The main attraction is its stunning waterfall which falls from 100 metres high into a huge natural pool. It is the highest waterfall in Mauritius. The sand dunes, situated close to the village, are called the Seven Coloured Earths because of the rare earth minerals found there.

Flic-en-Flac, located in the west of Mauritius, is a small coastal village. Its white sandy beach is one of the longest on the island. Local families and tourists are attracted to it because it has a lively atmosphere. They can participate in various water sports like canoeing or go on undersea walks using special equipment but most tourists prefer to go swimming with dolphins because it is such a unique experience. They can choose to stay in luxury hotels, private villas or with local families.

The Casela Nature Park offers a variety of fun and thrilling activities for individuals, families, and companies. The park is divided into six zones. Tourists can take selfies with majestic lions while being supervised and guided by a professional team. They can visit the Casela Zoo, home to an impressive range of African mammals like elephants, giraffes, hippos, rhinos and zebras. Adventure tourists can enjoy outdoor activities such as ziplining and quad biking trails. They can also go canyoning which is a sport that combines several outdoor sports such as rock climbing and swimming.

Dear Ahmed,

I hope you are well. I would like to tell you about my school project on floating markets.

Floating markets are found in places where boats are used to sell products like fruit, vegetable and handicrafts. These are run by local villagers. Today, most floating markets serve as tourist attractions providing travellers with an insight into a country's culture. Thailand, Vietnam, China, and Indonesia are famous for these kinds of markets. Based on an international tourism report in 2018, the oldest and most famous floating market is Damnoen Saduak which is located about 100 kilometres southwest of Bangkok, Thailand. It was founded in 1866.

Damnoen Saduak Floating Market consists of three smaller markets: Ton Khem, Hia Kui, and Khun Phitak. Ton Khem is quite a large market. Hia Kui has souvenir shops on its canal banks which sell goods to tour groups led by guides. Khun Phitak is the smallest and least crowded of the markets. It is rare to find a foreigner or tourist there.

Each Damnoen Saduak Floating Market consists of a network of narrow canals. Female traders, wear traditional mo hom apparel (blue farmers' shirts) with wide-brimmed straw hats (ngob) and these images are regularly used to attract tourists to Thailand. They use small wooden boats called sampans to sell locally produced vegetables and colourful fruit. The market is generally very busy in the morning every day from 7 to 9 and it stays open until midday. A roof was installed so that it could operate in all kinds of weather throughout the year.

As you would expect, Damnoen Saduak Floating Market is full of foreign and local tourists. According to some tourists, traditional handicrafts are greatly overpriced. Bargaining is a common practice, although the prices of souvenirs and food are generally quite cheap. Cooks prepare traditional Thai food such as noodles, grilled fish and rice with coconut milk on their small boats.

According to the Tourism Authority of Thailand, the market attracts around 300,000 visitors during the weekends, on Saturdays and Sundays. The Palace on Wheels is one of the top ten luxury train journeys in the world. It started operating in India on the 26th of January 1982 and is managed by India's National Railways. It runs once a week from September to April each year for eight days and seven nights. To avoid the monsoon season and the summer heat, it is recommended to go on this trip between the months of October and March.

The Palace on Wheels' goal is to provide 24-hour service to make every passenger feel as if they are kings and queens. This train has many modern facilities. There are 23 coaches on the train, and it can host up to a maximum of 104 passengers. Each coach has four cabins with luxury amenities such as individually designed single and double cabins, ensuite bathroom, wall to wall carpeting, entertainment system, Wi-Fi and personal assistants who do everything for their passengers, like making the bed, doing the laundry, etc. The train has two restaurants, *The Maharaja*, and *The Maharani*, that serve Indian, International, and Chinese cuisine. It has a magnificent lounge, library, and spa.

The train's journey is a seven-night, eight-day round trip that starts and finishes in Delhi, the capital of India. Passengers boarding the Palace on Wheels generally arrive in the afternoon at Safdarjung Railway Station where they are welcomed onto the train with flowers. The train departs at 18.30. While passengers are sleeping in their luxury cabins, the train arrives in Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan. It is also known as the 'Pink City'. After breakfast on day two, passengers have the entire day to explore the palace as well as the fort. On day three, passengers will find a very different type of adventure awaiting them. Stepping off the train at Sawai Madhopur, they are driven to the hills and forests of Ranthambore National Park for a safari in tiger country where these majestic animals can even be seen during the day.

The following morning, the train arrives in Udaipur, often referred to as the 'City of Lakes'. That night, passengers can experience a thrilling firework display from a traditional boat on one of Udaipur's beautiful lakes. The next stop, on day five, is the historic fort town of Jaisalmer. After lunch in a 7-star hotel, passengers are taken on a camel ride into the surrounding dunes where they enjoy displays of local music and dance as the sun sets.

The following day, the train arrives at Jodhpur. This is a fabulous city full of palaces, forts, and blue-painted houses that passengers can view seated on top of majestic elephants. The next day is spent in Agra, home to the fabulous Taj Mahal, one of the new seven wonders of the world. That evening, passengers are treated to a spectacular sound and light show followed by a feast on board the train. On the final day, day 8, passengers say farewell to the staff who have done everything to make their time on board, the Palace on Wheels, their most memorable ever.

The three mega-malls in North America; West Edmonton Mall in Canada, Mall of America and American Dream in the USA were developed by the Triple Five Group Company (T5GC) which is based in Edmonton, in Canada. According to the World Shopping Ranking 2020 report, these three mega-malls attract over 112 million visitors annually and they are the largest retail and entertainment centres providing shoppers with unique experiences.

The West Edmonton Mall located in Canada was opened in 1981. In the World Shopping Ranking List it is listed as the 23rd biggest in the world. It was the world's first largest indoor shopping centre from 1981 to 2004 according to the Guinness Book of World Records. It is currently the second largest shopping complex in North America after the Mall of America. It is 5,300,000 square feet and it holds over 800 shops including nine attractions such as Land World Waterpark and Adventure Golf. It has two hotels and over 100 dining areas with parking for more than 20,000 vehicles. This mall employs more than 24,000 workers and receives about 32 million visitors per year. It attracts between 90,000 and 200,000 shoppers daily, depending on the day and season.

The Mall of America was opened in 1992. It is 6 million square feet and is considered the largest mall in the USA, and the seventh largest in the world. It receives about 42 million visitors yearly. It has more than 520 shops, 50 restaurants, the nation's largest Nickelodeon theme park with 27 rides and attractions for guests of all ages. The majority of tourists like to visit this mall because of its world class tax-free shopping with no sales tax on clothing, shoes and accessories. Its top attractions include over 400 free events held annually, and a new 500-room Radisson Blu hotel connected to the mall by a sky bridge.

The company's newest complex is the America Dream Mall in New Jersey. It was partially opened to the public in 2019 after taking seventeen years to build. It is 4 million square feet and cost around 5.7 billion US dollars. It has more than 500 retail shops, 21 full service restaurants, a ski slope, a golf course, a year-round water park known as DreamWorks, an indoor ice rink, an arts and concert venue that can seat up to 3,000 people, Big Snow America Dream, Sea Life Aquarium, Mirror Maze, and many other entertainment facilities. It lost over 64 million US dollars in 2020 when it had to close its doors because of the global pandemic, COVID 19.
